European Solidarity  
Centre 600 m from  
the Montownia

A cultural institution established in 2007, it presents the contemporary history of Poland, the rise of the Solidarity movement and its heritage, located at 1 Solidarności Square.

World War  
700 m from  
the Montownia

Museum built between 2009 and 2017 located partly underground. It has one of the largest exhibitions presented by historical museums in the world. The attraction is located at 1 Władysław Bartoszewski Square.



Amber Museum  
Great Mill  
700 m from  
the Montownia

Erected by the Teutonic Knights in 1350, the Great Mill was the largest industrial building in medieval Europe. The largest industrial building in medieval Europe. It operated continuously until 1945. It now houses the Amber Museum. The attraction is located at Wielkie Młyny 16 Street



The Crane, National  
Maritime Museum  
1.3 km from  
the Montownia

This is a unique monument of technology and one of the icons of the historic architecture of Gdańsk. Built in the 15th century, the port crane, with its wooden structure, is the only of its kind preserved in Europe. The attraction is located at Szeroka 67 Street.



Soldek  
1.7 km from  
the Montownia

A unique monument of ship technology, the only steam-powered ore carrier preserved in the world today. The attraction is located on Ołowianka Street.

BHP Hall  
750 m from  
the Montownia

Built at the turn of the 19/20th century in the Imperial Shipyard. Initially, it served as a torpedo warehouse. In 1980, it was the venue for meetings of the Interfactory Strike Committee.



Artus Court 1.3 km  
from the Montownia

One of the most representative monuments located on the so-called Tract Royal Route in Gdańsk. It consists of: the ground floor of two connected the ground floor of two connected tenement houses called the Old House of the Bench, Artus Court proper and the New House of the Bench. The attraction is located at Długi Targ 43 Street.

A branch of the Gdańsk Archaeological Museum operating in a historic granary on Granary Island at Chmielna 53 Street, whose history dates back to the 16th century.



Imperial Shipyard  
750 m from  
the Montownia

The first of the modern shipyards for the production of warships in Germany, whose construction began in 1844. The first ship submarine was launched in 1905. From 1945 "Shipyard No. 1" and from 1947. Gdansk Shipyard. The attraction is located at Doki 1 Street.

Polish Post  
700 m from  
the Montownia

The Museum cultivates the memory of Polish Post Office defenders and their families, and brings closer the patriotic and social activities of Poles in the Free City of Gdańsk. The attraction is located at Polish Post Defenders Square 1/2.

St. Jan Church  
1.2 km from  
the Montownia

It dates back to the mid-14th century and is one of the most valuable monuments of the city. The church has an impressive preserved stellar vaulted ceiling, which was the setting for war films. The building is located at Świętojańska 50 Street.



The Main Town Hall,  
Museum of Gdańsk  
1.5 km from  
the Montownia

It is a Gothic-Renaissance building, located at the junction of Długa Street and Długi Targ Street. The Main Town Hall houses the Gdańsk Museum.



Gdańsk Shipyard  
4 km from  
the Montownia

One of the largest Polish shipyards, located on Na Ostrowiu Street in Gdańsk. It was established after 1945. It is a place of historic events for Poland and Europe, the cradle of the Solidarity movement.



Uphagen House  
1.5 km from  
the Montownia

The tenement house located at Długa 12 Street is the only one in Poland and one of the few 18th century bourgeois townhouses in Europe available to visit.



Old Toy Gallery  
1.5 km from  
the Montownia

This is a private museum located at Piwna 19/21 Street, the museum collection consists of historical toys manufactured in Poland in the years 1920-1989.

Green Gate  
1.5 km from  
the Montownia

The oldest water gate in Gdansk, built in 1568 using a the use of small-sized bricks, previously unheard of in Gdańsk construction, called Dutch bricks. The attraction is located at Długi Targ 24 Street
